

# EVENT REGULATIONS

Stadt Dortmund



UEFA EURO 2024 • FAN ZONE  
from 14.06. until 14.07.2024

## § 1 Scope

1. These event regulations apply to the relationship between visitors and the organizer. By entering the event site, visitors recognize these event regulations as binding.
2. These regulations apply to the enclosed venue and its installations for the FAN ZONE UEFA EURO 2024 Friedensplatz event and to the Westfalen Park during the designated operating hours.
3. The area covered by these event regulations at Friedensplatz extends beyond the actual enclosed event area to include sections – in both directions – of the adjacent roads around the junction of Prinzenstrasse, Balkenstrasse, Betenstrasse and Olpe, and also the Friedensplatz and Stadtgarten underground car parks.
4. The event regulations are posted on notice boards and can be found on the official website of the City of Dortmund at [dortmund.de](http://dortmund.de).

## § 2 Permitted Objects

Bags and rucksacks (gym bags recommended) with a maximum volume of three litres or not larger than 297 mm x 210 mm x 100 mm (A4-size).

Any qualified authorized person or relevant security authority (e.g. police) is entitled – including by means of technological devices – to inspect/search any person and their personal items (e.g. bags, rucksacks) upon entering the event area or while the person is in the event area.

## § 3 Prohibited Items

The following items may not be carried:

- Weapons, weaponlike objects or any other objects that could cause injury to persons
- Horns, vuvuzelas or other devices used to amplify noise and speech
- Gas spray cans or bottles with harmful contents, corrosive, flammable or colouring substances (with the exception of transport boxes for medical equipment, provided these do not exceed the dimensions specified in § 2), with the exception of standard pocket lighters
- Glass of any kind or any other containers made of fragile material that may shatter or splinter
- Bottles (except empty max. 0.5 ml PET bottles), cans, tankards or any other type of container that can be used as projectiles
- any food; exceptions apply to guests who are required to carry food and drink due to illness upon presentation of a medical certificate or appropriate identification. Catering for babies and small children is also exempt from the ban.
- Pyrotechnical devices of all kinds (including sparklers and flares), including launching devices for either
- Flag or banner poles that are not made of wood or PVC (or comparable flexible material) or that are longer than 1.0 meter or have a diameter greater than 10 millimetres
- Poles or sticks of all kinds
- Banners, doublepole flags, banners and flags larger than 2.0 meters x 1.5 metres
- Any items that might litter the event site, such as confetti, scraps of paper and balloons
- Laser pointers
- Alcohol, drugs and other narcotics
- Animals (unless they are assistance animals)
- Rightwing extremist, racist, nationalist, antisemitic, violence-glorifying or other hateful or youth-endangering propaganda material, as well as clothing, flags or other articles displaying such content
- Banners, printed material, newspapers and magazines, brochures or similar advertising materials for distribution or commercial purposes, unless expressly authorized by the organizer
- Objects that prevent identification
- Bulky items such as bicycles, e-scooters, scooters, ladders, stools, chairs, crates, suitcases, etc.
- Photographic cameras/apparatus, video cameras or other sound or image recording devices for commercial purposes or publication, as well as accessories (e.g. photo cases, tripods and, in particular, telephoto or interchangeable lenses), unless the organizer has given its consent.
- Flying and carrying unmanned aerial systems of any kind, e.g. drones and model airplanes, above and on the event area is prohibited.

The following are generally prohibited all day on every HC match day and Monday to Saturday from 18.00 hrs:

- Strollers, buggies, children's pushchairs
- Festival trolleys, handcarts

Walking aids and medical devices are generally permitted after inspection by security staff.

## § 4 Access Checks and Authorized Personnel

1. Visitors who are clearly under the influence of drugs or excessive alcohol or who are carrying weapons or other dangerous objects as defined in the above performance and do not agree to their seizure by the organizer's security staff will be excluded from the event.
2. In the case of visitors who, based on their behaviour or other indications, are suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or drugs or of carrying weapons or other dangerous objects as defined in § 3, the organizer's security personnel are entitled, with the visitor's consent, to inspect their clothing and belongings in order to clarify the matter and to determine whether they are under the influence of alcohol or drugs, including with the use of technical equipment. This inspection also includes items carried by the visitor (bags, jackets, rucksacks, etc.). Anyone who does not give their consent to this will be excluded from entering the event site and removed from the premises.
3. The provisions of the Youth Protection Act also apply.
4. Persons who pose a security risk or do not wish to be screened will not be permitted to enter the event grounds.
5. Persons who belong to right-wing extremist parties or organizations, are associated with the right-wing extremist scene, make racist, nationalist, antisemitic, violence-glorifying, sexist, homophobic or other dehumanizing statements at the venue or have already done so in the past will be denied access to the event or excluded from it. In particular, persons wearing clothing typical to the extremist scene, displaying familiar symbols, combinations of numbers or letters, or displaying and/or distributing items such as flags or propaganda material, will also be barred from the event due to their appearance.

## § 5 While at the event site

Visitors must remain exclusively in the areas designated for them. To ensure that children stay within the authorized areas, they must be supervised by their parents or legal guardians at all times.

Every visitor is required to comply with the instructions of the organizer, the police, the authorities, the fire department, the emergency services and security personnel, as well as any microphone announcements.

Rescue and escape routes as well as escape doors and gates must be kept clear. They must not be adjusted or their function altered in any way. Escape doors and gates must only be opened in an emergency.

All visitors must immediately inform an authorized person (e.g. security staff) or the appropriate security authority if they become aware of any damage to property or of an accident.

Waste, packaging and empty containers must be disposed of in the waste garbage cans provided and must not be dropped as litter.

The venue will be monitored as needed using a video surveillance system in accordance with Art. 6 para. 1 lit. F GDPR. All footage will be treated confidentially by the proprietor of the event site, but may be used as evidence, specifically in the event of suspected and/or confirmed criminal offences; in such cases, the proprietor of the event site may pass the footage on to the relevant security authorities.

By entering the venue, the visitor consents to the creation of images of his/her person.

Every person entering the event area agrees that they will only make audio and/or video recordings of the event for private use. The personal rights of other guests must be respected at all times.

Every visitor to the event must behave in such a way that no one else is subjected to harassment, harm or endangerment. Racist, dehumanizing and offensive remarks and slogans are not permitted.

Visitors may be denied entry or expelled from the event site if official requirements or the safety of the event (e.g. due to overcrowding) prevent them from entering or remaining at the event.

### The following behaviour and activities are also prohibited:

- Climbing onto or over equipment, enclosures, barriers, fences, walls, facades, masts, lighting systems, scaffolding, trees, hedges, planting areas, tents, vehicles, sales stands and roofs, including any rigging and anchoring devices of any kind
- Throwing objects
- Littering the grounds, e.g. with confetti, scraps or rolls of paper, as well as urinating outside the toilet facilities provided for this purpose
- Lighting fires and setting off pyrotechnic products
- Painting, writing and attaching stickers to structures, equipment and paths
- Drunken behaviour, drug use and/or wearing a mask that conceals one's identity, behaving violently or in any other way contrary to public order or giving rise to concerns of such behaviour
- Carrying out targeted commercial advertising of any kind, e.g. distributing advertising brochures or other written information relating to a business, product or service, without special authorisation
- Standing on furniture in the event area (tables, chairs, benches, deckchairs)
- Smoking in the designated smokefree zones, including the use of ecigarettes
- Consuming cannabis
- Collecting signatures, presenting petitions or services of any kind

A violation of the aforementioned regulations is also deemed to have occurred if a person aids and abets another person in a prohibited act or incites another person to commit a prohibited act.

Further exceptional requirements may be imposed in order to prevent, minimise or eliminate risks to life, health or property.

Visitors of the UEFA EURO 2024™ Fan Zone, take note that their voice, image and likeness recorded during their time in the Fan Zone may be used, free of charge, in any image, sound and audiovisual material in connection with UEFA EURO 2024™, either simultaneously or at a later date.

## § 6 Domiciliary Rights/Supervision

The representatives and authorised agents of the Marketing and Communication Department of the City of Dortmund hold the domiciliary rights (i.e. the right of the owner or occupier of premises to undisturbed possession). The police, the public order authority and the public order service are authorised to enforce domiciliary rights.

## § 7 Liability

Visitors enter and use the event area at their own risk. All visitors acknowledge that they can be held liable for damage or loss resulting from their actions while on the event site.

The City of Dortmund is only liable for damage to property caused by intentional or grossly negligent behaviour on the part of its employees, legal representatives and subcontractors. In all other cases, the statutory provisions apply.

## § 8 Offences

Persons who intentionally or negligently violate any provision of the Event Regulations may be removed from the event and banned from entering.

If it is suspected that visitors have committed a criminal offence, charges will be brought.

The rights of the holder of the domiciliary rights remain unaffected.

## § 9 Severability Clause

Should any provision of these Event Regulations be invalid, the remaining provisions shall nevertheless apply and the invalid provision shall be replaced by a provision that is valid and corresponds to the meaning of the invalid provision.

The holder of the domiciliary rights reserves the right to make appropriate changes to the Event Regulations if necessary. The current and valid version can be found on the official website of the City of Dortmund [dortmund.de](http://dortmund.de).

## § 10 Applicable Language Version

The event regulations were drafted in German and translated into English as a minimum. In the event of discrepancies between the German and translated versions, the German text shall prevail.
